The baby houses are closed for the winter period to ensure that our babies stay healthy during these colder months, but we have several other options that will allow you to serve the children, both onsite at Door of Hope Village and offsite in your own spaces and places.



ON-SITE OPTIONS

Join us in the action on or around Mandela Day by coming to Door of Hope Village. We hope your visit will help you to better understand the mission of Door of Hope and that it will provide a tangible way to join in the work Door of Hope is doing to save abandoned babies.

Brick-making

It takes bricks to build a village! We need to make as many bricks as possible in order to build houses at Door of Hope Village. We have decided to celebrate Mandela Day throughout the month of July by focusing our energy on brick building. Sign up to bring your team to the Village to either pour moulds or demould previously poured bricks.

Mandela Day Open Day

Come see the good work being done at Door of Hope Village! On July 18th your team can sign up for one of our seven, one-hour time slots to tour the Door of Hope Village and drop off donations for the babies.

OFF-SITE OPTIONS

Sometimes, for whatever reason, it may not work out to support Door of Hope 'on-site' for Mandela Day. But that needn't stop you from still honouring Mandela at this special time and giving of yourself in support of Door of Hope. ON-SITE OPTION 1 Brick Making

We have the inspirational vision to build a Village in order to provide homes for all our children that can't get adopted. We are facilitating teams as part of our Mandela month campaign to help us make Stumbelbloc bricks.

Your team can participate by raising funds to purchase the materials for the bricks and then by providing the labour necessary to make the bricks. This is construction type work but does not require specialised skills, so almost anyone who is physically able to do manual labour can join in. A good-sized team is in the region of 16 people.

Cost

There are several costs involved in making the bricks, so we are requesting **R18** per brick produced. They are larger than normal bricks and allow for a Lego type construction. The goal for your team will be to make **440 bricks** in the day, equating to around **R8 000**. If extra money can be raised, those funds can be allocated to the other substantial costs of building the homes.





What to Expect

Teams will either pour concrete into moulds or demould bricks depending on the day you sign up. You can decide how much time you want to spend at the Village. It is messy work, so please wear clothes that can get dirty and closedtoed shoes. Work gloves and a 5 cm paintbrush will also be helpful. You may want to bring water/snacks for your team to enjoy when it's time for a break. We will have personnel on site to help, so don't worry, you don't have to be a

brick-building expert. To learn more about Stumbelbloc bricks visit <u>www.stumbelbloc.com</u>.

Sign Ups

The brick making campaign is our main drive for "Mandela Day," so we have extended this over the month of July to get as many bricks made as possible. The brick making involves two parts, the making of the bricks and then the demoulding of the bricks two days later. We have allocated slots where your team can come to the Village to participate in either of these activities as needed.

OFF-SITE OPTION 1 Creating Awareness

We need your help to spread the news about Door of Hope around our community and the world. Every year approximately 3500 babies are being abandoned in South Africa. We need help creating awareness so that desperate mothers will know there is a better alternative and so that we can have the resources we need to care for the children in our care.

This month consider sharing the mission of Door of Hope with your business or group.



The Door of Hope Story

Door of Hope exists to care for abandoned babies. This thriving mission began in 1999 as an initiative of the Berea Baptist Mission Church. Based in the inner-city of Johannesburg, the pastor, Cheryl Allen, and the church leaders discovered that scores of babies were being abandoned each month, many of which died. Cheryl realized that many of the desperate women and girls might have acted differently had there been an alternative. The church made a hole in their wall and a 'Baby Bin' was installed allowing for mothers to leave their babies any time, day or night, for the church to take care of.

By faith and reliance on God, and from small, humble beginnings, the ministry has grown with hundreds of children's lives being saved. There are now three baby houses, housing a total of anywhere from 70-80 babies at one time.

The need for Door of Hope has become all the more urgent with abandonment continuing to increase and adoptions decreasing by as much as 50% in recent years. In order to provide a home for children that are not being matched with forever families, Door of Hope is building a children's village. The Village will be a space where those children who don't get adopted will find a home and a family to be raised with love and care. Numerous homes will be built where house parents will care for up to six abandoned children in each dwelling.

OFF-SITE OPTION 2 Fundraising

It takes a lot of resources to care for up to 80 babies at a time. We go through 10,000 nappies a month alone! As a Non-Government Organisation we rely on donations from supporters in Johannesburg and all over the world.

There are several ways you can help us provide for the 70 children currently in our care. Every item donation and monetary donation go a long way in helping us to care for our babies.

Below are ideas for how you can engage your group to give to Door of Hope.

Monetary Donations

Charge an 'entrance fee' on Mandela Day of R67 per person, in honour of Mandela's 67-year fight for justice.

Set a target of a certain amount you want to raise as a group.

Ask the company to match the funds that are raised.

Consider becoming a LifeChanger (monthly giver) or a LifeSaver (adopting a cot and sponsoring a child in that cot). Brochures about our fundraising initiatives can be found on pages 4-9 of the Resource Pack.

Item Donations

DOOR OF HOPE 30 SECONDS GAME

30 Seconds is a South African fast-paced general knowledge game. Players generally play in teams of two to sixteen. One player must guess a word from their teammate's explanation, much like *Charades*, with the aim to guess as many possible answers in 30 seconds. The main restriction on the explanation is that it may not contain the actual word or part of the word.

Teams

This game is played by two or more teams. The more players per team the better. For example: if six people want to play, two teams of three players are better than three teams of two.

Objective of the game

Teams score points by correctly identifying the names that their teammates are describing. Teams must strive to identify as many names as possible during each turn of 30 seconds – the most being five.

Rules of the game

Describing and Identifying

Players are called describers and identifiers. All players must take their turn at being both describers and identifiers. The describer within a team must rotate with each turn.

Describers MAY:

Describe the names in any way they wish, including singing, humming and gesticulating;

Describe the names in any order;

Use the words 'and' and 'the' that appear in some of the names.

Describers MAY NOT:

Say the actual names on the card in their hand; Look at the names that must be described before the timer is turned over; Say any names or words derived from or related to the names they are describing; Use any 'sounds-like' or 'rhymes-with' tactics; Say or refer to the letters of the alphabet; Use translations; Point to anything.

Identifiers MAY:

Use the letters of the alphabet.

Houses must have front and back door as well as windows, as per the plan.

Materials can be secured before the competition starts but not cut or prepared.
